




Redesign of Summit Lake Apartments

Option 1: Extending Miller and Lake, adding a new road next to the Towpath Trail



What features would you like to see more of or prefer in your ideal home?







Summit Lake Apartments Resident Survey

- 158 surveys completed out of 237 occupied units 67% response rate

Individualized Supports

meet residents where they are (~Economic Stability)

establish a single point of contact trained to provide holistic support

Whole Child Investment make space for youth voices (~Youth)

involve youth in developing local programs
work as connected village to address gaps
create a youth navigator position to facilitate
connection to appropriate programs

focus on connection, respect, value
